CONCLUSIONS: Psychosocial risks in pregnancy, but not in early infancy, contribute to the transmission of vulnerability from maternal ACEs to child development outcomes in infancy via maternal behavior Maternal health risk in pregnancy indirectly confers risk from maternal ACEs to child development outcomes at 12 months of age through infant

Erikson's Stages of Life 1. Infancy: Birth to 18 Months

Erikson also referred to infancy as the Oral Sensory Stage (as anyone might who watches a baby put everything in her mouth) where the major emphasis is on the mother's positive and loving care for the child, with a big emphasis on visual contact and touch If we pass successfully

A child's early home environment has long-term effects on development A child's early home environment has a profound effect on his well-being Beginning in infancy, a problematic home environment can disrupt the brain's stress response system, reduce the quality of caregiving a child receives, and interfere with healthy development¹

Infants: (0-18 months)

- May begin puberty—evident sexual development, voice changes, and increased body odor are common Emotional/Social
- Increased ability to interact with peers
- Increased ability to engage in competition
- Developing and testing values and beliefs that will guide present and future behaviors
